Intro & Purpose



Ladies and Gentlemen,

Artificial intelligence (AI) is changing the world as one of the epoch-making inventions in human history.

The fact is: Intelligent bots, agents and robots will take over the work of many people on this planet in the coming decades. Almost all economically active organizations will leverage the potential of AI in order to keep up with the market, achieve leaps in quality or counter the consequences of a shortage of skilled workers.

People will only have a chance of finding wealth-preserving and meaningful jobs if they understand the consequences of AI as early as possible, find new jobs and are qualified for them. AI will therefore profoundly change work and collaboration.AI must therefore not be understood and shaped as an IT system, but above all as an organizational structural change.

The Human Friendly Automation Alliance first came together for this purpose in 2020: People who understood the magnitude of the change brought about by AI for employees and managers very early on and have since been working on measures both in practice and in science to achieve a balance between efficiency and the need to preserve dignified and value-creating work for people. AI should improve people's lives, never make them worse.

The aim of the Human Friendly Automation Alliance e.V. is to create this awareness among decision-makers internationally and to sustainably build up knowledge for the implementation of human-friendly automation through knowledge transfer.

Transfer of Knowledge

Developing and deepening knowledge among decisionmakers and interested parties in politics, business, the public sector and science about AI and digital automation projects in order to organize human work well, i.e. in a dignified and value-creating way, in a sustainable manner.



Raising Awareness

Implementation of effective publicity measures (events, publications, media work, newsletters) to raise awareness of HFA among decision-makers in business, science, the public sector and politics across all sectors.

Ensuring dignified and value-creating work for people in line with economic goals under the influence of artificial intelligence (AI) and digital automation.

Values & Tools

Platform for science and practice to develop values, principles, success criteria as well as methods and approaches for application in operational practice as public goods in order to make human-friendly automation the standard for small and large players.

Sounding & Audits

External assessment and provision of expert knowledge for Al & automation projects at practice partners to ensure dignified and value-creating work in line with economic goals.

Facts & Figures: Überblick von der Gründung bis heute



- The HFA Alliance was initiated in June 2020 as a loose network by Dr. Lars Schatilow, who is also the namesake of "Human Friendly Automation".
- Since its foundation, the network has organized publicly accessible meetups (approx. every 3 months) and, since September 2021, the annual Human Friendly Automation (HFA) Day.
- Organizers of the HFA Days and thus official supporters of the HFA Alliance so far are the organizations IBM Deutschland GmbH, Deutsche Rentenversicherung Bund, Bundesagentur für Arbeit and RWE AG.
- The HFA Alliance network includes around 240 people from all sectors who regularly take part in events.
- Since its foundation, the HFA Alliance has been supported by the Institute for Social Science Research (ISF) Munich and within the framework of the BMAS-funded humAlnWorkLab project.
- Founding members of the HFA Alliance published the publication (anthology) "Human Friendly Automation" in October 2023 as part of the above-mentioned BMAS research project. The HFA Alliance has developed a globally valid charter of values and principles that many organizations use.
- The HFA Alliance annually recognizes organizations that are committed to maintaining dignified and value-creating work in the AI era.
- In 2023, the state of Rhineland-Palatinate officially committed to using HFA in the implementation of the state's <u>Digitalstrategie des Landes</u>.
- HFA Meetup-Community counts 515 members (July 2025).
- HFA-LinkedIn-Community counts 630 members (July 2025).
- On March 17, 2025 HFA Alliance was formally registered as association (e.V.) in Moenchengladbach, Germany.
- The HFA Alliance and its partners are currently developing success criteria for AI projects as new KPIs, which will be made publicly available to all interested parties.




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Membership: Opportunities to join in

Core members strategically & operationally of the association. Elected in accordance with the Articles of Association.


Individual member (active & passiv)
